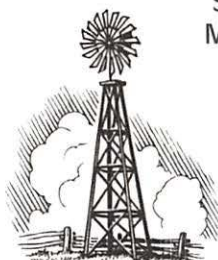

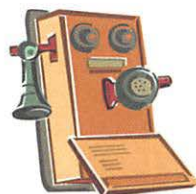

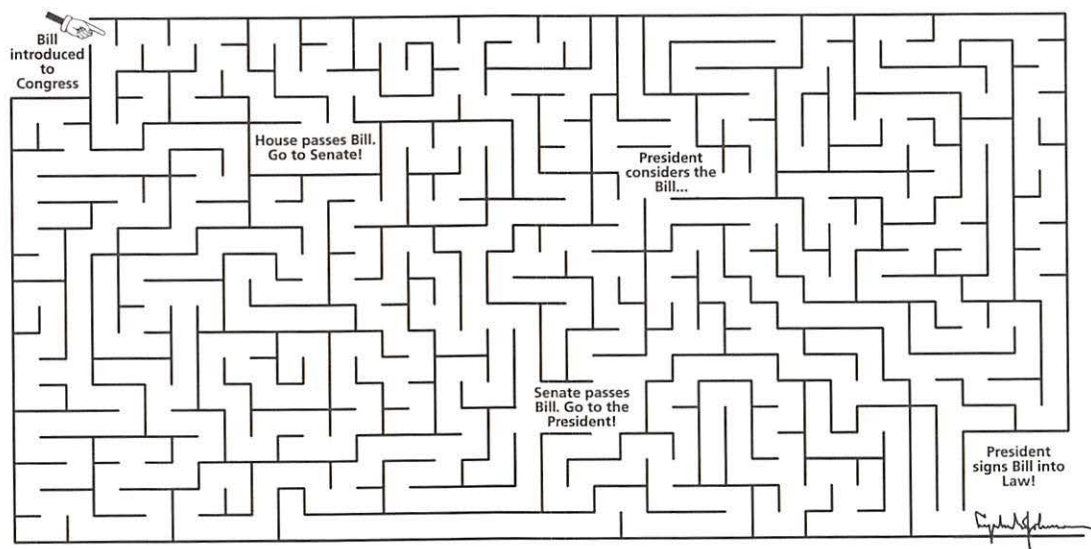

Lyndon Johnson was in the legislative branch for much of his career. Complete this maze and you will see how a bill becomes law.

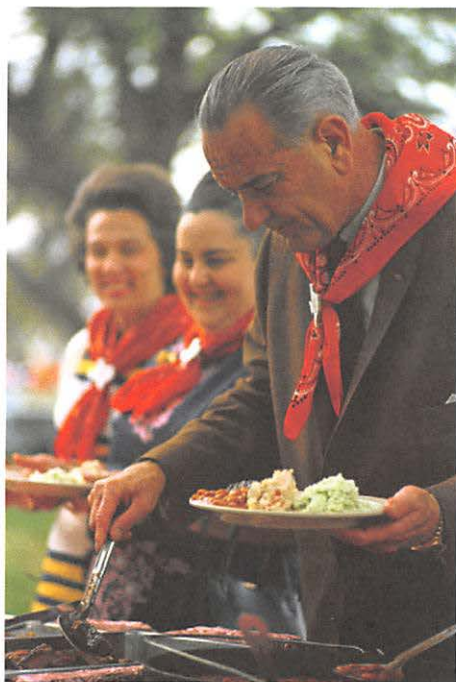




Barbecue on the Pedernales

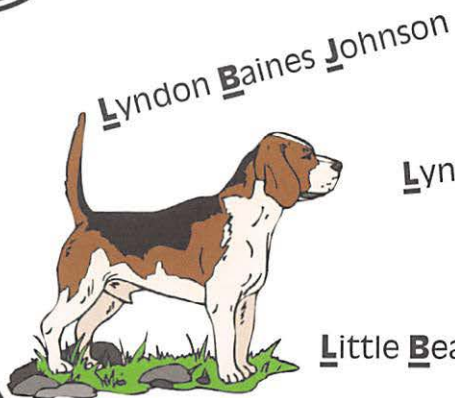

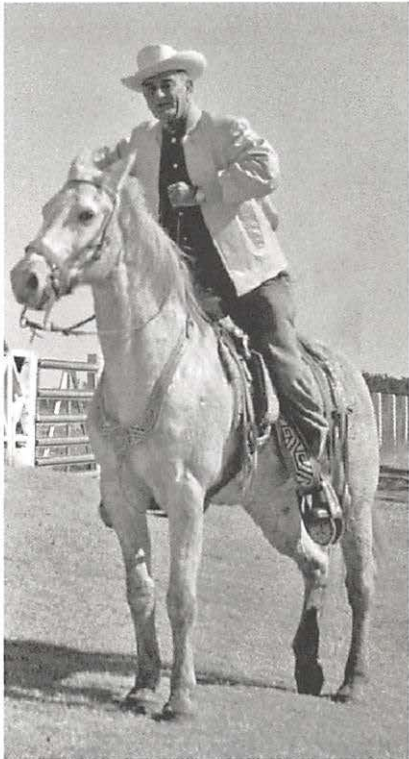

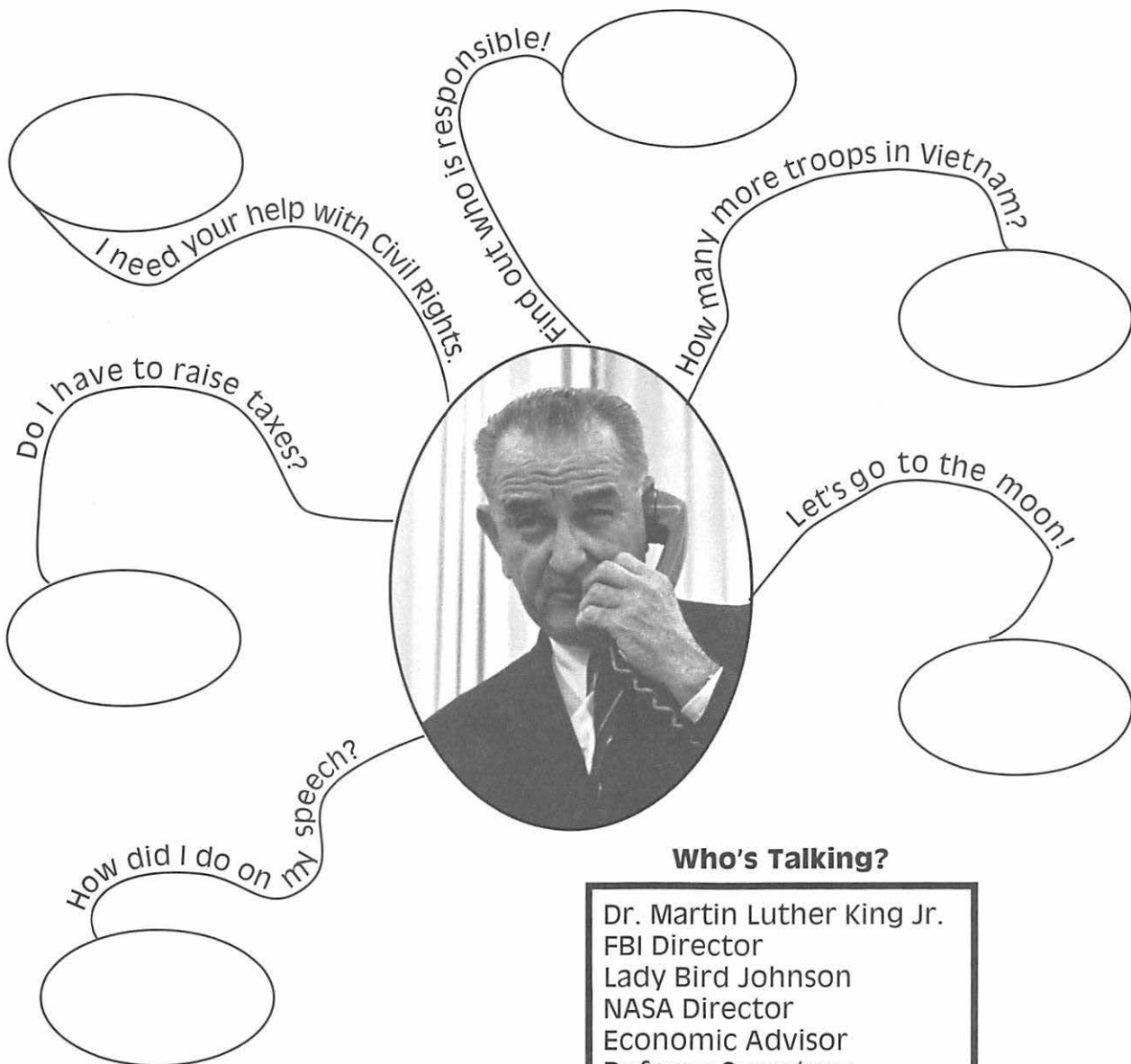
